

Call for papers

Introduction

Critical situations of malaise, stigmatization and pain are emphasized by different authorities. Failure at school, high-risk behaviours and suicide attempts appear like three consequences of a feeling of deep ill-being in the face of latent or explicit homophobia.

The goal of this conference is to take the necessary time to elaborate tools which could remedy this situation of vulnerability. In this way, the researchers are appealed to bring an interdisciplinary descriptive and analytic content aiming at making the debate objective. As for the institutional actors, pedagogic experts and managers of the educational programs, they will come and present their practical experiences. Another light will be shed by the associations which create tools in terms of listening, support and education on the acceptance of the other in their differences.

This time of exchange will be based on the question: "Education and Homophobia, a form of discrimination in the educational system: overview, actions, and intermediaries of action". Therefore three expressions of homophobia will be questioned: the one made against children, teenagers or pre-adults who wonder on or live their homosexuality; but also the one which is organized around homoparental families, taking into account the consequences on the child who is growing up within them; and finally the expression of homophobia against homosexual instructors and teachers..

The expected scientific communications could be organized in the envisaged thematic lines below or propose new questionings.

Thematic aspects of the conference

A / Overview

Objective

The line "overview" offers to lay the foundations of a discussion about the societal grounds and stakes of the homophobic discourse. After an analysis of the fantasies and representations on homosexuality, the communications shall describe the impact of homophobia in a quantitative and qualitative way. The line shall end up with an analysis of national and international models of struggle against homophobia.

A-1/ Fantasies and representations of homosexuality: analysis of the homophobic position A-2/ The sexuality of teenagers and pre-adults: the high-risk behaviours as reflection of the difficulties of speaking. The coming out in question

A-3/ The suicide attempt: an extreme attempt of communication?

A-4/ Analysis of different national and international models of struggle against homophobia

B/ Actions within school path

Objective

This line proposes to investigate the practices and actions used to make the models of struggle against homophobia operational by dealing with the construction of the educational programs, and the question whether they match the educational path and its context. At the end of these works led in this line the objective is to question the current and future uses of the teaching aids.

Themes

B-1/ Actions led in schools: general strategies

B-2/ A subject which can be tackled by every school discipline: towards a cross-disciplinary approach?

B-3/ Actions specifically led according to the sociocultural context of the child, the teenager or the pre-adult (area targeted for special help in education, rural, secular or confessional teaching...)

B-4/ The adequacy of actions according to age: for a better public awareness and listening ear?

C/ the intermediaries of action

Objective

Children, teenagers or pre-adults grow around several educative influences which reinforce or question the speeches delivered in the educational system. This line proposes to explore how, according to their age or their sociocultural backgrounds, they make up their viewpoints on homosexuality. The discussion shall open up to the potentiality of an educative model which would aim at reaching the acceptance and respect of the diversity.

C-1/ The dissonance of discourses on homosexuality between school, family and extracurricular: consequences

C-2/ Extracurricular and construction of gender and sexual orientation: between hetero/homosexual standards

C-3/ The coming out and gay parenthood: tools of discussion and acceptance?

C-4/ Appropriations of lesbian and gay icons and references to develop one's personality despite a homophobic environment

C-5/ From the gay-friendly tendency to the decompartmentalization of the LGBT community: emergence of the acceptance of the other in their differences?

Taking part in this conference

Two types of interventions are envisaged during this event:

The scientific interventions selected by the scientific committee. The latter will carry out a double-blind evaluation of each paper and will pronounce a decision about whether the said document is accepted or not. Moreover, it will be able to give to some papers the possibility to integrate the poster session.

The oral communications shall not last more than 20 minutes, including 15 minutes of presentation and 5 minutes of questions. Some time will be let at the end of each discussion group for completing the exchanges between the parties of the workshop.

The poster session. It will permit the scientists who were not selected for an oral intervention to communicate about their work.

The propositions (2 pages maximum, including the bibliography), shall be composed of the following elements:

• The title of the communication;

• The accurate name and address of the author(s) (email, administrative address, telephone number)

- A summary of the communication (around 3,000 characters including blanks)
- A brief bibliography
